Glazed Cabinetry: What to Expect

Glazed cabinetry consists of Painted base finishes with a decorative layer of glazing. The hand-wiped application allows the glaze to settle naturally into corners and grooves, adding a layer of contrast. Glazing's appearance will be more prominent on lighter-toned base finishes, such as paints. Conversely, glazing will be less prominent on darker-toned base finishes. No two doors will be exactly alike, which is part of glaze's custom effect.



Care & Cleaning

While our laminate, painted and wood finishing processes promote durability, care should be taken to preserve the original factory finish:

- > Wipe up spills immediately
- > Use mild soaps only
- > Be sure to read all cabinet care guidelines and cleaning product instructions carefully

Environmental Factors

Cabinetry added at a later date may not match the original cabinets installed. This may be due to:

- > Exposure to sunlight, smoke and chemicals
- > Change in door samples or displays due to age (they may no longer be a true color representation)
